Hoodstock Reaches \$1 Million Goal

We did it! With the \$106,000 raised at Hoodstock XIX, we have officially raised \$1 million since Hoodstock started in Russ and Jen Causey's backyard nineteen years ago.

A sincere thank you to Russ Causey, who has chaired Hoodstock and performed each year since its inception. Today, Hoodstock is Unified's signature fundraiser, and the proceeds benefit individuals living with disabilities by supporting Unified's programs and services.

"I am blown away by the growth of Hoodstock. To go from my city backyard and generating \$1,200, to performing at The Winslow for more than 400 people and raising \$106,000, is beyond anything I could have ever imagined," says Russ. "We never would have made it without the support of my life partner, Jen Causey, and my Hoodstock partner, Lauren Bussard. I am so proud of what Hoodstock has accomplished and the village of volunteers that makes it happen."

Hoodstock XIX featured Russ' band Roses n Rust and live music by The Wafflers, The Ooh La La's and Exit, showcasing the rock/folk music scene of the late '60s and '70s, mixed with today's music.

A highlight of the evening was the presentation of the Samuel A. Tucker Memorial Can Do Award to Jerel Layne by Baltimore Ravens Senior Advisor for Player Development and former Unified board member O.J. Brigance. Jerel was recognized for his work over the past eight years with Unified's Assistive Technology program using his Nova Chat communication device. O.J asked everyone to give Jerel a standing ovation for his determination to become an independent and active member of the community.



Development News

The **Greenspring Advisors Grant Program** awarded Unified \$10,000 to enhance and rebuild its Employment Services program in Hagerstown. A portion of the funds will be applied to a \$3,000 annual membership in Maryland Works' Provider Network group, allowing Unified to enroll staff in educational programs or professional development training workshops. The remaining funds will be used to give staff the opportunity each quarter to participate in at least one educational program or workshop.

The Washington County Gaming Commission awarded Unified \$4,928 to purchase community theater tickets for individuals in Washington County who receive our support. This gift enhances our Community Development Services (CDS) program in Hagerstown, which provides individuals with disabilities opportunities to participate and engage in their communities to help build confidence and social skills. These funds will allow all 44 CDS participants to attend two shows throughout the year at either Antietam Recreation or the Washington County Playhouse Dinner Theater.

The **Maryland Transportation Association (MTA)** awarded Unified \$234,000 to purchase four new vans for our fleet of vehicles that transport individuals to and from our day habilitation centers, work sites, medical appointments, recreational outings as well as local community sites such as banks, churches, libraries and stores.

Congratulations to Jerel Layne, recipient of the 2022 Samuel A. Tucker Memorial Can Do Award. Jerel, who has an intellectual disability that makes his speech difficult to understand, has worked monthly for the past eight years with Unified's Assistive Technology Services to learn and practice with a Nova Chat communication device. Jerel demonstrated the device's functionality when he spoke at this year's Hoodstock XIX upon receiving his award, with family and friends cheering him on.

A resident of Beltsville, Maryland, Jerel's use of his Nova Chat has really helped him communicate his needs and achieve more independence in life. As an active member of the community, participating in Zumba, book club, music class and bowling, Jerel uses his communication device to share his wants, needs and stories with others. He loves using it to share videos of himself participating in community events and then uses his vocabulary to talk about his adventures. With the safety of having a means to communicate, Jerel has even started to take MetroAccess for transportation.

Over the past several years, Jerel has also used his Nova Chat to learn letters, numbers and colors. Last year, Unified staff programmed a speech on Jerel's Nova Chat so he could wish his sister a happy birthday. This year, at Jerel's 30th birthday party, he used it to give a speech to all who attended.

Jerel was so excited in January 2021 to receive a brand new Nova Chat. He is a social person, and his Nova Chat has given him the opportunity to independently share his thoughts with familiar and unfamiliar listeners. Jerel has come a very long way with his communication and pre-academic skills over the past eight years, and his accomplishments toward independence make him a deserving recipient of the Can Do Award.
